CALL TO ORDER: Mayor Irene called the meeting to order at 6:30PM.

CITIZEN ADDRESSING THE COUNCIL: CCSD#2 elementary principle Tracy Schneider introduced herself. She expressed her appreciation to be living and working back in the area that she grew up. She mentioned her efforts looking into the reorganization of a preschool in Elk Mountain that would need to be self-funded. She indicated that such a program may help to boost the attendance numbers at the local school in the future. She stated she would work to keep the school open as she knows the negative effects on a town due to closure having experienced that herself.

REPORTS:

<u>Fire Dept:</u> Assistant Chief Hayes told the Council the department responded to 10 calls last month. The "250 fire" (milepost 250) was caused by a piece of hot metal off of a vehicle. The BLM also responded and finished the response since it was their responsibility. The town's fire department also provided mutual aid to the Rawlins F.D. when they sent a request for fire 2 miles south of Rawlins. The "265 fire" is believed to be arson. Evidence was collected and will be turned over to DCI to join the investigation with the State of Utah. Fires were set at many points along the route beginning in Utah across I-80 through Wyoming.

Asst. Chief Hayes told of the new plan for fire prevention week. In hopes of reaching more than the 4 enrolled in the elementary school they will be hosting the local youth at the firehouse. The date will be announced and a time planned to accommodate the largest number of attendees.

SCWEMS: Next meeting is September 11th at the Saratoga Station at 6:00PM.

Water Dept.: SuperintendentEastman said everything is running well with nothing to report.

Zoning: Eastman reported that he attended the FEMA meeting in Saratoga. The Council would like to mention in a newsletter that flood plain maps are available to view in the town hall. We will plan a public meeting with FEMA representatives to discuss results in the coming months.

<u>Public Works:</u> Mayor Irene told the Council Director Neuman has had the backhoe serviced so it is ready for winter.

<u>HCJPB:</u> Ken and Pam Campbell reported that the new landfill operator Adam Waxweiller was introduced to the board. They also told of complaints of the landfill not thoroughly covering the garbage as they were accustomed to with the previous operator.

<u>Museum Board</u>: Cm. Kenneda said the museum closed for the season after the Labor Day weekend. The board members and museum director will offer scheduled tours through the winter and ask to be contacted if anyone is interested.

<u>CCCOG</u>: Mayor Irene attended the special meeting in Saratoga. CCCOG agreed to hire George K. Baum and Co. to be the consultants for the 6th penny special purpose tax re-authorization. All entities agreed to get their projects with costs and timelines to County Clerk Bartlett by November 9th. The cost of \$38, 060.00 will be paid for by the participants according to the percentage share of the last specific purpose tax they received for their project. Elk Mountain's share is \$3638.16. The next meeting will be in Hanna on September 19th at 6:30 PM.
