Fire Department: No Report

SCWEMS: Mayor Irene presented the SCWEMS report to the council. Morgan reported that it has been business as usual. Morgan also updated the council on the status of the Hanna ambulance barn property.

Public Works: Will Redmond, the Public Works Director, presented the public works report to the council. Will reported that the garbage truck is running well and will be serviced and given a bath this week. The lagoon is running well also. The water treatment plant controls for well 3 burned up last week and well 4 has been running. Browns Hill Engineering will be here this week to fix the issue with well 3. The WYDOT paving project on Highway 72 will begin this week and plan to pave Bridge Street next week, weather permitting. Will also reported that we received a rough estimate for adding a new water tank and load station which came in at 1.2 million. We will research grants to help alleviate the cost. Will has also gotten a quote to fix and update the fire hall heating in the amount of \$3,800.00. Will also shared the bids Voltech had given him for the fire hall in the amount of \$13,900.00 and for the wastewater lagoon in the amount of \$39,800.00.
